


Ann-Kay Lin ARAM LRAM ARCM GRSM MA (Wales), also known as Ho Wai-On, lives in London. She studied piano, singing and composition at the Royal Academy of Music on a John Swire UK Scholarship and RVW grant. She subsequently participated in courses on music and dance, production and direction of film and television, and computer music in the UK and USA. Best known as a composer, her works have been performed in concert halls and festivals in the UK and abroad since 1974. Her long list of compositions includes works for vocal, choral, instrumental, ensemble, orchestral and electro-acoustic combinations; and music theatre, music for dance and the theatre, multi-media and cross-cultural combined-arts. She has staged many cross-cultural combined-arts projects in Britain and abroad.

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Notes on Chinese:

China has been using pinyin (a standardized pronunciation for Chinese characters using alphabets) for some time. Whilst this is helpful for people who have knowledge of Chinese, it is confusing for most English speakers, as pinyin is not pronounced in the usual English way, and some long accepted forms of Chinese names now looking quite different – e.g. *Peking* becomes *Beijing*, *Canton* becomes *Guangzhou*, *Sung* Dynasty becomes *Song* Dynasty (not pronounced as song in English), *Ching* Dynasty is now *Qing* (with *Q* sounding like *Ch*), and *X* as in *Xiang Yu* – the hero of work No. 6 on this CD – is pronounced as *Hsiang*. I am using pinyin for Chinese used in this book because it is becoming very widespread.
